

LOGIE ESTATE MEMORIAL POLICY

Introduction

Given the beautiful nature of Logie Estate and its popularity among visitors, we recognise it may hold great sentimental value to those who have spent time here.

This policy aims to provide consistent and respectful handling of memorial requests on Logie Estate.

This policy applies to requests to place memorials on land owned by Logie Estate.

Memorial Options

The Estate's preference is to plant memorial trees with, if desired, an accompanying memorial name plaque. Regrettably, we are unable to support memorial benches or other memorial items.

Native tree species are preferred, and suitable ground conditions will be checked before going ahead.

Memorial Agreement

To ensure clarity on who is accountable for future maintenance of both the tree and name plaque, the following terms must be agreed to:

- The tree becomes part of Logie Estate and the liability to look after and maintain it rests with the Estate. This extends for the full life of the tree and the Estate will have the right to take necessary action, including carrying out works on the tree without notice.
- It would be your responsibility for ongoing maintenance of the name plaque. If it falls into a state of disrepair and is deemed unsafe, the Estate will have the right to remove it without notice.
- The Estate will not be liable in any way if the tree or name plaque is damaged, stolen or vandalised, but you would be welcome to replant the tree or replace the plaque should you wish to do so.
- It would be your responsibility to cover the cost of both the tree and name plaque.
- Your contact details will be held by the Estate but will only be used to contact you about the memorial and will not be shared.

Once an agreement has been reached, a mutually convenient date and time for planting will be organised.
